Dear Mr. Ketchum:

We have approved the second extension of time requested for your FY 2000 Native American Graves Protection and Repatriation Act [NAGPRA] grant with the National Park Service (Grant Number 40-00-GP-232). James Rementer, NAGPRA Project Director, faxed the request to our office on November 29, 2002.

By this action:

- (X) Extension. The scheduled end date for this project is extended by seven months from **December 31, 2002**, to **July 31, 2003**.
- (X) <u>Final Project Report</u>. The Final Project Report and final payment request are now due by no later than **October 31, 2003**. The Final Project Report must include the final Work-Cost Budget breakdown summarizing the actual costs charged to the grant, and any products required by Condition 16 of the Grant Agreement. Failure to submit an acceptable Final Project Report may cause NPS to withhold payment or prevent your tribe from being considered for future NAGPRA grants (see Condition 7.c. of the Grant Agreement).
- (X) <u>Additional Remarks</u>. According to our records, the current unexpended balance on this grant is \$22,493.91.
