











## Lenape Names for the Arms and Body

These are the names and parts of the arms and body known to the Lenape or Delaware Indians. This list continues two previous ones; one about the head, and the other about the hands. In the first column are links in blue that can be clicked to take you to the Lenape Talking Dictionary ([www.talk-lenape.org](http://www.talk-lenape.org)) where you can hear the Lenape name. The middle column contains a photo of the part. In the third column is the literal translation or comments of the Lenape name.
