












LENAPE NAMES OF OTHER BODY PARTS

These are names and drawings of some of the body parts as used by the Lenape or Delaware Indians. In the first column there are links that can be clicked to take you to the Lenape Talking Dictionary (www.talk-lenape.org). Place the cursor over the link and click to take you to the dictionary where you can hear the Lenape name. The middle column has an image of the parts named, In the third column in *italics* is the literal translation of the Lenape name or additional information.
