



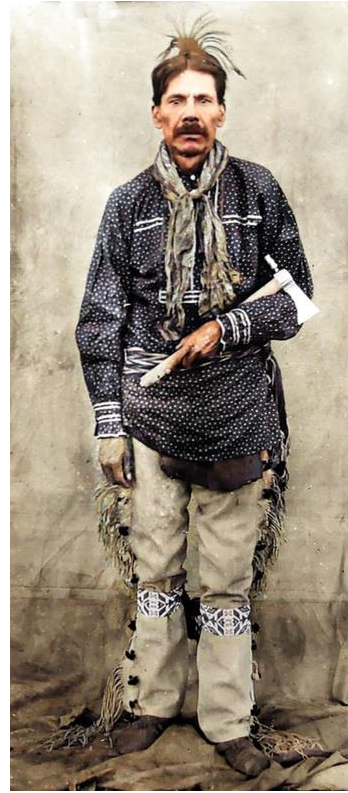


Lenape Photos After Colorizing vol. 3

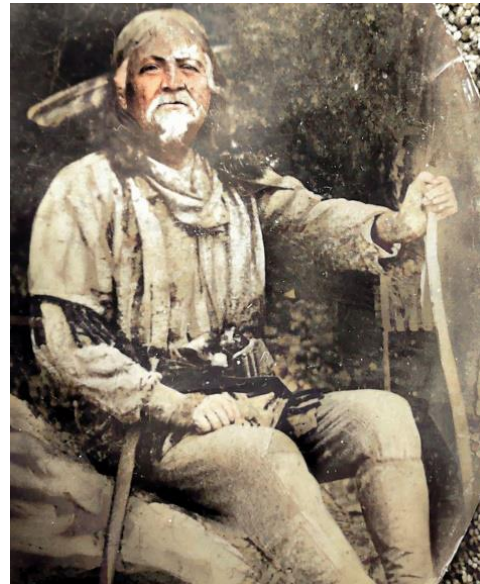

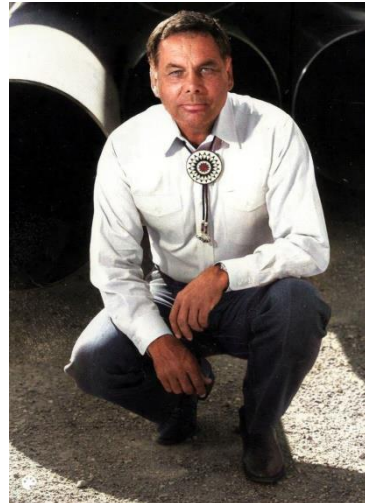
