Survey Map of the Delaware Cemetery


In 1979, Dr. Terry Prewitt of the University of Tulsa was doing a study of Delaware religion, and he asked if there was anything he could do to assist the Delaware Tribe. Glenn McCartlin who was head of the Delaware Cemetery Committee told him that it would be nice if there was a good map of the Delaware Cemetery northwest of Dewey. The Cemetery Committee at that time consisted of Glenn, Nora Thompson Dean, and Warren 'Judge' Longbone.

Mapping was begun by Terry Prewitt on January 16th and 17th of 1980. The work crew consisted of Glenn, David Oestreicher, and Jim Rementer. The work was continued in May, on the 14th and 21st, and Terry Prewitt was assisted by Glenn, Jim, and Suzanne Ferguson. The final map was draw by Karen Haworth.

On the map every marked grave is shown. In addition, every feature such as a mound or depression that may be a grave is also shown. On the original map even the contour lines of the cemetery were shown, but the map supplied with this document shows only the graves and possible graves.

In addition to the map there is a directory of the grave numbers in numerical order, and a directory by name in alphabetical order.

There is also a veterans' directory prepared by Warren 'Judge' Longbone in 1990.

IMPORTANT REPAIRS NEEDED AT THE DELAWARE INDIAN CEMETERY

September 1995

- 1. Six loads of topsoil are needed at this time to fill in the graves and other areas to bring them up to level or to correct drainage problems. Melvin Hoppock of Ochelata has been recommended for this. His rate is \$55.00 per load, and therefore the total would be \$330.00.
- 2. Once the ground has been leveled, grass needs to be planted to prevent further erosion.
- 3. Some grading work needs to be done in the area of the road that is within the cemetery. Since the ditch on one side of this road was filled, water tends to stand on several graves on the south end of the cemetery. Charley Dean has offered to do this, and asks for any volunteers who wish to help.
- 4. The trash bin which was removed has been replaced with a trash barrel. An enclosure of wire also needs to be built to burn the trash at the cemetery.
- 5. All known graves need to have some type of marker placed on them. When it is known who is buried there the name can be added to the marker, otherwise just a plain gravestone will indicate the location of the grave. This is a project to be done sometime in the not too distant future.
- 6. We are still looking into the possibility of having a survey done by either Ground Penetrating Radar, or by Electric Resistivity Method to determine the exact location of the older graves. It may be possible to have this done under a grant, and we will report other information on this as it becomes available.
